1. Two options are offered: a) 40 hour option which provides a broad training in agriculture or b) 32 hour option which allows a secondary concentration in economics or business.
2. Nine semester hours of coursework in quantitative business methods is required. Must include three hours of statistics (with college algebra or finite math pre-requisite) and three hours accounting (six hours desired).
3. ANS 121-122 will satisfy the major requirement of three hours in Animal Science and PLSS 200 will satisfy the three hour Plant and Soil Science requirement.
4. CHEM 140B only required by Agricultural Management Resource Option.

The baccalaureate oriented associate degree (typically the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science) satisfies the University Core Curriculum requirements for graduation. University Core Curriculum coursework required for the Agribusiness Economics degree is not automatically waived by the baccalaureate oriented degree. The occupational-vocational associate degree (the Associate in Applied Science) graduate should explore SIUC's Capstone Program option.
