SIUC will accept and evaluate all transfer oriented/college parallel credit and coursework classified as vocational-technical. The University Core Curriculum Substitution List indicates the courses that will be accepted and evaluated as core curriculum credit. Courses/credit not on this list that are acceptable for other than core curriculum credit are evaluated by the academic unit/major of the student.

GRADING SYSTEM: A, B, C, D, F, FA(failure with excessive absences), S(satisfactory), U(unsatisfactory), NR(no grade reported), WF(officially dropped with permission of the student's dean but failing at time of withdrawal), W(withdrawal). SIUC calculates a GPA for admission purposes only and it is not included in the cumulative average, except for honors purposes.
