1. The Associate in Applied Science degree in automotive technology from Danville Area Community College will fulfill the Department of Automotive Technology Curriculum requirements for freshman and sophomore level automotive courses at SIUC.
2. Students who transfer into the SIUC Automotive program with an A.A.S. will begin the automotive curriculum at the junior level.
3. Transfer credit for students with less than an A.A.S. degree will be evaluated on a course by course basis.
4. Courses submitted for consideration must have been completed no longer than five (5) years prior to the date of credit transfer to SIUC.
