The above courses are identified as articulating in from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville to Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, because each may assist you in achieving required courses towards your Bachelors of Science degree in Paralegal Studies from SIUC. In order to graduate from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale Paralegal Studies program with a Bachelors of Science degree, students must also complete an introduction to computer course and either a basic accounting course or a medical terminology course. If students pursue the General Paralegal Studies path at SIUC, they need to complete at least 12 hours of Business/Computer Courses, from which FIN 270, FIN 280, ECON 241, ECON 240, MGMT 304, and MKTG 304 are choices. If students pursue the Pre-Law specialization of Paralegal Studies at SIUC, they need to complete 12 different hours, including 9 hours of 300-400 level Liberal Arts Courses, some of which are identified above as choices that articulate in from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville.
