**Transfer Credit Articulation Report**

The Transfer Credit Articulation Report is a representation of a living data file consisting of course substitution data that has been placed into SIUC's Student Information System (SIS). This data is used for purposes associated with evaluation of transfer credit, degree audit and as a reference tool for advisement. As changes are made to the course substitution data placed in this file, course entries will not be deleted but notation will be made on beginning and ending dates.

**EFFECTIVE DATES**

Reflects course attendance dates for which the stated equivalency relationship is true.

**TRANSFER COURSE TITLE**

The title of the transferred course from the sending institution. If more than one course is involved in the equivalency relationship only the title of the first course is listed.

**TRANSFER COURSE NUMBER(S)**

The sending institution's department abbreviation(s) and course number(s) of the transferred course(s) required for the relationship.

**SIUC EQUIVALENT COURSE(S)**

The SIUC course(s) to which the transfer course(s) equate(s). Where all of the SIUC equivalent courses listed are required for a major all of the course requirements will be satisfied. If only one of the courses listed is required for the major then only that one course will need to be used to satisfy the requirement. In either case only the number of hours assigned to the transfer course will be awarded, therefore even though the course requirements have been satisfied there may be additional elective hours required in order to meet the hours requirement for the major.

When more than one course from the sending institution is equated to more than one SIUC course, more than one possible equivalency relationship may exist between the courses. Each individual relationship is listed separately, therefore the same course may be listed on more than one line. Some courses may have a minimum grade requirement at the major level which could affect their applicability toward degree requirements; consult SIUC's [Undergraduate Catalog](#).
